#### **GRCF Dream Fund**

At the December 17, 2018 Finance Committee, we informed the Committee of a new Fund set up by the Grand Rapids Community Foundation within the Challenge Scholars Fund. Hence, this new fund is only available to the three Challenge Scholars schools, plus Sibley and Stocking. This new fund, the Dream Fund, is to be funded at a maximum dollar amount of \$165,000 through June 30, 2019. The amount set aside in the Fund can be accessed through an application process by administrators, students, parents, and also community organizations. There are three categories of grants: Micro—dollar amount of grants \$1,000 or less; Mini—dollar amount of grants \$1,001-\$10,000; and Large—dollar amount of grants in excess of \$10,000 up to \$50,000. Grant applications from parents and community members, as well as the large grants, only became available as of January 1, 2019. All grant applications have to first have the approval of the building administrator and the related executive director before they are sent to an evaluation committee for consideration.

Mary Jo Kuhlman, the GRPS Business Office and representatives from GRCF have met on two occasions to understand the program and to ensure that proper controls are in place to account for the funds being disbursed. All grants made to GRPS employees are processed through the business office. GRPS has no accountability for grants that will be made to non-GRPS employees (parents, community organizations). GRCF only requires a brief memo at the conclusion of the event/project funded by the Dream Fund.

BOE policy requires all donations of \$2,500 or greater to be approved by the board. Many of the grants already awarded are below this threshold; there are several that are greater than \$2,500. To alleviate the potential for constantly coming to the BOE for approval of individual grants in excess of \$2,500, which would also slow down the process of funding the grants, the Business Office is asking the BOE to approve the following:

- 1. BOE approval of the Dream Fund and its total funding of \$165,000.
- 2. For individual grants of \$2,500 up to \$9,999, the Business Office requests that the approval process for these grants be as follows: Building administrator, executive director, Ms. Kuhlman and the CFO. The BOE would receive a report monthly of all Dream Fund grants between \$2,500 and \$10,000 approved under this process.
