
History of US Immigration Policy

"All Americans, not only in the states most heavily affected but in every place in this country, are rightly disturbed by the large numbers of illegal aliens entering our country. The jobs they hold might otherwise be held by citizens or legal immigrants. The public service they use impose burdens on our taxpayers. That's why our administration has moved aggressively to secure borders more by hiring a record number of new border guards, by deporting twice as many criminal aliens as ever before, by cracking down on illegal hiring, by barring welfare benefits to illegal aliens. In the budget I will present to you, we will try to do more to speed the deportation of illegal aliens who are arrested for crimes, to better identify illegal aliens in the workplace. We are a nation of immigrants. But we are also a nation of laws. It is wrong

and ultimately self-defeating for a nation of immigrants to permit the kind of abuse of our immigration laws we have seen in recent years, and we must do more to stop it."



WHY AMERICA IS NOT A NATION OF IMMIGRANTS



THIS ELIMINATION IS SEEN THROUGH THE GENOCIDE OF 80+ MILLION INDIGENOUS PEOPLES, FORCED ASSIMILATION (THROUGH NATIVE BOARDING SCHOOLS), CONTINUED DISAPPEARANCES OF INDIGENOUS WOMEN AND TWO SPIRIT PEOPLES, RESOURCE EXTRACTION / VIOLATIONS OF TREATIES, AND MUCH MORE.


"Settler colonialism has best been defined as more of an imposed structure than an historical event. This structure is characterized by relationships of domination and subjugation that become woven throughout the fabric of society, and even becomes disguised as paternalistic benevolence. 



The **Chinese Exclusion Act** was a United States federal law signed by President Chester A. Arthur on May 6, 1882, prohibiting all immigration of Chinese laborers. Building on the 1875 Page Act, which banned Chinese women from immigrating to the United States, the Chinese Exclusion Act was the first law implemented to prevent all members of a specific ethnic or national group from immigrating.


The Committee on Public Information (1917-1919), also known as the CPI or the Creel Committee, was an independent agency of the government of the United States created to influence public opinion to support US participation in World War I.

In just over 26 months, from April 14, 1917, to June 30, 1919, it used every medium available to create enthusiasm for the war effort and to enlist public support against the foreign and perceived domestic attempts to stop America's participation in the war. It used mainly propaganda to accomplish its goals.

Anti-German attitudes were cultivated during WWI, - such as this cartoon here on the right.

The Committee on Public Information also played a significant role in shifting public opinion to support going to war, because Germans were being demonized.






It was perfectly ok for white people to demonize the Japanese Americans for decades prior to WWII.

The public then supported the rounding up of thousands of Japanese Americans, which were put into internment camps.






Anti-Semitism is widely accepted and practice in US culture.

During WWII, the US refused to allow thousands of Jewish people who were fleeing Nazi Germany.



The US/Mexican border was more open and fluid for a long time. The militarization on the US side really began in the 1980s then escalated in the 1990s after NAFTA was passed and again became even more militarized after Sept. 11, 2001, when the Department of Homeland Security was created.







AMAZON Collaborates with ICE to Separate Immigrant Families

The Amazon Web Services' cloud computing platform is the host for Palantir's Investigative Case Management (ICM) software. ICM is then used by Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) to manage their caseload and facilitate the tracking down and deportation of undocumented immigrants. Palantir, a data analytics firm, receives taxpayer dollars to provide these algorithms to government agencies, with its ICE contract being worth over \$51 million. For its part, Amazon in turn receives \$600,000 a month from Palantir. In addition, Amazon's new home-security company (Ring), works with hundreds of law enforcement agencies and ICE to provide video from the Ring system that can also be used to target the undocumented community.











