DECLARATION

Movimiento Cosecha is a nonviolent movement fighting for permanent protection, dignity, and respect for over 11 million undocumented immigrants in the United States. Our name, "COSECHA" (Harvest), honors the long tradition of activism by farmworkers and the ongoing pain of thousands of undocumented workers whose labor continues to feed the country. Committed to achieving real victories for our community, Cosecha believes in the power of non-cooperation, leveraging the labor and consumption power of immigrants to force meaningful change in public opinion.

In Michigan, immigrants are workers, mothers, fathers, daughters, sons, and grandparents—individuals fighting not only for their families but for an entire community. Immigrants, including the undocumented, strive to create a better world for our children, one where we can live with respect and dignity as the human beings we are. A world where everyone has the right to a decent home, dignified work, fair wages, healthcare, education, healthy food, clean water, and more.

A world where we don't have to leave behind our families, countries, or cultures; a world where crossing borders doesn't criminalize us. A world where we don't have to work ourselves to death just to survive.

Movimiento Cosecha Michigan reaffirms its commitment to resistance. We have already begun forming community support groups because only THE PEOPLE WILL SAVE THE PEOPLE. We declare that we will not allow ICE to prey on our community, tear families apart, or abduct our immigrant workers.

We will demand that local and state authorities declare their cities and counties as sanctuaries, prohibiting collaboration between local and state police with ICE.

Movimiento Cosecha Michigan will continue to fight tirelessly for the dignity, respect, and permanent protection of all immigrants in Michigan, declaring that we will not accept any ICE raids or deportations in our state.
